REPORT OF THE CLAIMS COMMITTEE

REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

Committee Chair Dale reported that the Legislative Committee met the morning of October 25, 2022, and had a lengthy discussion on whether legislation should be pursued to allow retired teachers to return to the classroom. No action was taken, but staff will investigate the topic further. Higgins then reported to the Board that staff will pursue legislation to address an employer's proportionate share of unfunded liabilities should they leave PERS. Higgins also reported to the Board that air time (allowing members at retirement to purchase up to three years of nonqualified service at actuarial cost) would be researched further before bringing any proposed legislation to the Board in December. The final potential legislation that was discussed was to change the vesting period from eight-year back to four-year; Higgins said this issue would be reviewed by staff for consideration of the Board at a later time.

REPORT OF THE DEFINED CONTRIBUTION COMMITTEE

Committee Chair Rutledge reported that the Defined Contribution Committee met October 24, 2022, and heard from TIAA, VALIC, and VOYA on the Optional Retirement Plan Annual Review. He also reported that the committee heard an overview of the new CREF R4 class option for Mississippi Deferred Compensation members. No committee action was taken on either item.

REPORT OF THE INVESTMENT COMMITTEE

Committee Chair Breland reported that the Investment Committee met October 24, 2022, and heard a market update and performance review from Callan; a capital market assumption presentation from Callan, miscellaneous updates, and fixed income manager presentations from Manulife, PIMCO, Loomis, and PGIM. Angelo Gordon Value-Add Fund XI

Breland presented the Board with an additional value-add real estate commitment, as recommended by staff and Callan. The investment is a \$75 million additional commitment to the AG Realty Value Fund XI based on their tenure, stability, and their success in managing value-added real estate and along with pacing projections indicating its necessity to achieve PERS' 15 percent target in value-add real estate
